The 2020 Laureate for the Banque de France Prize for Young Researchers in Green Finance is Mr Olivier David Zerbib, who holds a doctorate from the University of Tilburg and is affiliated with the Institut de Science Financière et d'Assurances (Université Lyon 1) and the Center for Research in Economics and Statistics (CREST)

In 2018, the Banque de France decided to create a Prize for Young Researchers in Green Finance with the aim of promoting research in this new discipline*.

Like last year, the award ceremony took place during the "Green Finance Research Advances" academic conference co-organised by the Banque de France and the Institut Louis Bachelier, with the participation of the Institute for Climate Economics (I4CE) and Finance for Tomorrow**.

The prize was awarded by Sylvie Goulard, Deputy Governor of the Banque de France: "As for the 2019 edition, I am very pleased with the quality of the applications that have been submitted to the assessment of the Prize's international selection committee "***, Sylvie Goulard declared, "I warmly congratulate Olivier David Zerbib for his project, which is about 'Dynamic asset pricing with pro-environmental preferences', a core issue not only for public authorities, but also for the academic community at large. This Prize marks the importance that the Banque de France gives to the development of academic research in the field of green finance."
